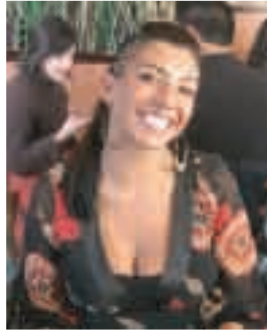


BIRTHDAYS & ANNIVERSARY
